2	MR. PETER STECKER: Okay. I'll turn it over to you,
3	Elsa, to call the roll, please.
4	MS. ELSA RUBIN: Yes. Good evening, everybody.
5	Welcome to this meeting to this public hearing of the
6	explanatory statement. So I'm going to call everybody's
7	name. Velene Acquah.
8	MS. VELENE ACQUAH: Present.
9	MS. RUBIN: Member?
10	MS. ACQUAH: Public.
11	MS. RUBIN: Can you hear me?
12	MS. ACQUAH: Yes, you're going in
13	MS. SANTIAGO: You're breaking up.
14	MS. ACQUAH: and out.
15	MS. ACQUAH: Yeah.
16	MS. RUBIN: Oh, okay.
17	MS. ACQUAH: Public member, present. Right.
18	MS. RUBIN: Lamont Badru, public member.
19	MR. LAMONT BADRU: Here.
20	MS. RUBIN: Eddie Mae Barnes, public member.
21	MS. EDDIE MAE BARNES: Here.
22	MS. RUBIN: Eliot Cherson, owner representative.
23	MR. ELIOT CHERSON: Present, but not in Hawaii,
24	unfortunately.
25	MS. RUBIN: Kenneth Finger, owner

1	MR. KENNETH FINGER: I'm here.
2	MS. RUBIN: representative.
3	MR. FINGER: I'm here.
4	MS. RUBIN: Evelyn Santiago, public member.
5	MS. EVELYN SANTIAGO: Present.
6	MS. RUBIN: Tamara Stewart, tenant representative.
7	MS. TAMARA STEWART: Present.
8	MS. RUBIN: So with that, we are going to I
9	think, Peter, you have to make an announcement?
10	MR. STECKER: Yes, I have to read the opening first.
11	So I'll go ahead and do that.
12	In response to the governor's directive to take
13	every effort to keep New Yorkers safe, mitigate the
14	spread of COVID-19, and pursuant to Executive Order 202-1
15	and its updates, the Westchester County of Rent
16	Guidelines Board will be conducting a public meeting to,
17	among other things, certify the guideline rate for rent
18	adjustment for housing accommodations within its
19	jurisdiction subject to the Emergency Tenant Protection
20	Act of 1974 for leases commencing between October 1st,
21	2020 and September 30th, 2021, via teleconference.
22	Instructions for members of the public to simultaneously
23	listen to the meeting will have been posted to HCRs
24	website for the Office of Rent Administration under the
25	public hearing section prior to this meeting. This

1 meeting will also later be transcribed, and the public 2 will have the ability to view the transcript.

3 So that's the opening statement. I just have one 4 thing that I want to address first. I've had a number of 5 you reach out to me because you haven't yet received the 6 payment for the June 2020 meetings, for which most of you 7 have submitted the cert -- the vouchers at this point. I 8 did follow up with the higher-ups at ORA. And all the 9 vouchers that have been sent to me have been forwarded to 10 Albany. At this point, I'm advised that none of the 11 boards have yet been paid. It's thought that, you know, 12 with everything going on with the budget as well as with 13 limited office staff capabilities, things like that, it's 14 taking longer than usual to process the payments. But we do expect that they'll be forthcoming shortly. 15

So that's really all the information that I have at this point. There's nothing else any of you need to do other than, if there's an outstanding voucher, to get it to me.

Secondly, on the vouchers, I did email everyone the copy of the voucher that needs to be filled out for this meeting. Most of you have emailed me back saying that you'll be returning it to me via mail after tonight's meeting. If that doesn't work for you and you need me to send you a paper copy with a return envelope, I'm happy

1 to do that. But other than that, that's -- and other 2 than that, the -- the next date for the meeting will be sometime in early 2021, but we can talk about that, I 3 4 quess, later on in the meeting. 5 So with that, Chair, I'll turn it over to you, if 6 you want to start addressing various items in the -- in 7 the notice for --8 MS. RUBIN: Yes --9 MR. STECKER: -- the agenda. 10 MS. RUBIN: -- well, before I move to the review and 11 finalize of the explanatory statement, I wanted to ask 12 you if there's any status that you can give us on the 13 next tenant representative. 14 MR. STECKER: The next tenant representative. I 15 know that we did reach out to the County. The County is the one who actually sent it over to us for us to 16 interview the individual that will be on the board. 17 So 18 we have reached out to them, advised them of the vacancy. 19 As of this point, we haven't been sent anyone to 20 interview, but that is something that we will be 21 following up on. I believe that that's one of those 22 things that has kind of been sidetracked by everything 23 that's been going on the last few months, but I will make 24 it a point to follow up on that and see exactly where 25 that is in the status.

1 MS. RUBIN: Yes, Eliot. MR. CHERSON: Question. So maybe I wasn't paying 2 attention. I apologize. So has the Board of 3 4 Legislatures approved somebody for that position? 5 MR. STECKER: Not at this point, no. 6 MR. CHERSON: Oh, so it's really -- oh, it's got a 7 long way to go then. 8 MR. STECKER: Yeah, I mean, it could -- it could 9 happen quickly, but you know, I, frankly, don't --10 haven't followed up with them in some time, so I don't 11 really know -- I'm sorry. 12 MR. CHERSON: Is someone nominated --13 MR. STECKER: Not --14 MR. CHERSON: -- to the legislature --15 MR. STECKER: -- not that I know of, Eliot. But again, I haven't followed up in a few months on that, so 16 17 I'll make it a point to do so and let the board know. 18 MR. CHERSON: Okay. MS. BARNES: Are they using a different process this 19 20 time? Because usually, it goes before the Board of 21 Legislatures before it comes to us, right? MR. STECKER: Right. And that -- that's what I'm 22 23 saying. We haven't been -- we haven't gotten to that 24 point, yet. 25 MS. BARNES: Okay.

1	MR. STECKER: So nobody's been sent to us yet to					
2	interview and you know, get that whole process underway.					
3	MR. CHERSON: But us is not board us is not us,					
4	it's					
5	MR. STECKER: Right, right. I'm talking with my					
6	MS. BARNES: The Board of Legislature.					
7	MR. STECKER: right. So the agency interviews					
8	them, and you know, then there's an appointment after					
9	that.					
10	MS. BARNES: Okay.					
11	MR. STECKER: But you know, Jean Anderson's					
12	resignation was submitted earlier this year. And you					
13	know, I think that coincided with everything being shut					
14	down with the pandemic. So you know, I'm I wouldn't					
15	be surprised if there hasn't been much movement over the					
16	last three months on it.					
17	MS. ACQUAH: Um-hum.					
18	MS. STEWART: By the way, I ran into Jean in a store					
19	in New Rochelle maybe about two weeks ago, three weeks					
20	ago, and she's doing okay.					
21	MS. ACQUAH: Oh, great.					
22	MS. SANTIAGO: Oh, good. Glad to hear.					
23	MS. ACQUAH: Yes. Um-hum.					
24	MS. RUBIN: Okay. Peter, I think that we can move					
25	to the review and finalize of the explanatory statement.					

1	MR. STECKER: Well, first, you know, there's usually
2	two votes taken on these. If somebody wants to make a
3	motion to combine them but the first one would be a
4	certification of the guidelines is the first item on the
5	agenda.
6	MS. RUBIN: I move to certify.
7	MS. SANTIAGO: Second.
8	MR. STECKER: Would you like me to call the roll,
9	Chair?
10	MS. RUBIN: Yes, please.
11	MR. STECKER: Okay. Elsa Rubin.
12	MS. RUBIN: Yes.
13	MR. STECKER: Velene Acquah.
14	MS. ACQUAH: Yes.
15	MR. STECKER: LaMont Badru.
16	MR. BADRU: Yes.
17	MR. STECKER: Eddie Mae Barnes.
18	MS. BARNES: Yes.
19	MR. STECKER: Eliot Cherson.
20	MR. CHERSON: No.
21	MR. STECKER: Ken Finger.
22	MR. FINGER: No.
23	MR. STECKER: Evelyn Santiago.
24	MS. SANTIAGO: Yes.
25	MR. STECKER: And Tamara Stewart.

1 MS. STEWART: Yes. 2 MR. STECKER: Okay. So that motion passes by a vote 3 of six to two. 4 MS. RUBIN: Should we now discuss the review for 5 dates for future meetings? MR. STECKER: Well, first, Chair, the review -- the 6 7 second vote, if the board decides to do so, would be a 8 review and finalize and adoption of the explanatory --9 MS. RUBIN: Yes. MR. STECKER: -- statement for the 2020 --10 MS. RUBIN: Yes. 11 12 MR. STECKER: -- 2021 guideline period. MS. SANTIAGO: So moved. 13 14 MS. BARNES: Second. 15 MR. STECKER: I'm sorry, that was moved by Evelyn? 16 MS. SANTIAGO: Yes. MR. STECKER: Okay. And second by Eddie Mae --17 18 MS. BARNES: Eddie Mae. 19 MR. STECKER: -- right? Okay. 20 MS. BARNES: Yeah. 21 MR. STECKER: Okay. You want me to call the roll, 22 Chair? 23 MS. RUBIN: Yes, please. 24 MR. CHERSON: Can you repeat the question? Sorry. 25 Can you repeat the -- the motion?

1	MR. STECKER: Oh, sure. It was a motion to finalize
2	and adopt the explanatory statement for the 2020-2021
3	guideline period that was circulated to the board last
4	week.
5	MR. CHERSON: Okay.
6	MR. STECKER: Tamara Stewart.
7	MS. STEWART: Yes.
8	MR. STECKER: Evelyn Santiago.
9	MS. SANTIAGO: Yes.
10	MR. STECKER: Ken Finger.
11	MR. CHERSON: Ken, you're muted.
12	MR. FINGER: No.
13	MR. STECKER: Eliot Cherson.
14	MR. CHERSON: No.
15	MR. STECKER: Eddie Mae Barnes.
16	MS. BARNES: Yes.
17	MR. STECKER: LaMont Badru.
18	MR. BADRU: Yes.
19	MR. STECKER: Velene Acquah.
20	MS. ACQUAH: Yes.
21	MR. STECKER: And Chair Rubin.
22	MS. RUBIN: Yes.
23	MR. STECKER: Okay. That motion to adopt the
24	explanatory statement also passes by a vote of six to
25	two. So Chair, I'll just I sent you the certification

1 language that's needed for you to countersign, so if you 2 could just --3 MS. RUBIN: Yes, uh-huh, I have it here. I'm 4 sending it to you tomorrow. 5 MR. STECKER: Okay. Great. Thank you. So, Chair, if you want to move on to the dates, now would be the 6 7 appropriate time to do that. 8 MS. RUBIN: Yes. We need to set up a date for 9 January for our first meeting of the year, January 2021. So maybe we should give tentative dates. 10 MS. SANTIAGO: The only thing I want to interject is 11 that the schools are -- the -- the winter break is until 12 13 January the 4th. I mean, I don't know's -- who'll be going away, but just -- just to keep it in mind. 14 15 MR. STECKER: (Indiscernible) beginning the --January 18th. 16 17 MR. FINGER: Perhaps it could be a Monday night 18 again. 19 MR. CHERSON: Let's not do January 21st. You know 20 why? 21 MS. ACQUAH: Um-hum. 22 MS. BARNES: Oh. 23 MS. ACQUAH: Yes. 24 MR. CHERSON: That's in (indiscernible)? 25 MS. ACQUAH: Yes.

1	MS. BARNES: I have to get my calendar.
2	MR. FINGER: How about January 20 28th then, so
3	we'll all be the happier in morning.
4	MR. CHERSON: Exactly, exactly right. You can find
5	me on the on the road to Canada.
6	MR. FINGER: 28th okay?
7	MR. CHERSON: Okay with me.
8	MS. SANTIAGO: Elsa, you're muted.
9	MS. BARNES: I had to get a calendar.
10	MS. RUBIN: Peter, I was saying maybe you want to
11	send us three or four dates and we pick among
12	ourselves
13	MR. STECKER: Yeah
14	MS. RUBIN: and get back to you.
15	MR. STECKER: we can set it up like I set up the
16	date for this meeting if that's
17	MS. RUBIN: Yes.
18	MR. STECKER: preferrable to you.
19	MS. SANTIAGO: Works for me.
20	MR. FINGER: Okay with me.
21	MS. SANTIAGO: Please. Good.
22	MS. STEWART: Thank you.
23	MR. STECKER: I'll send that out tomorrow then.
24	MS. BARNES: Okay with me.
25	MS. ACQUAH: Yep. Um-hum.

1	MS. RUBIN: Okay. I think other business?						
2	Anybody wants to bring up any issue, any						
3	MR. FINGER: I I I don't have an issue, but						
4	let me see if I'm muted but if Jane (sic) is feeling						
5	better, maybe we could reach out to her to rejoin the						
6	board. Is it Jane not Jane.						
7	MS. ACQUAH: Um-hum. Jean.						
8	MS. BARNES: Jane Anderson?						
9	MR. FINGER: Yeah, yeah, Jane Anderson. She's						
10	healthy again, maybe she would like to rejoin the board.						
11	What if						
12	MS. STEWART: While she's she is she said						
13	she's feeling better, she still has two siblings who have						
14	a lot of health issues and she's you know, in addition						
15	to minding her own health, she's also trying to help with						
16	them. So I don't think that she'd be interested because						
17	she said she has a lot on her plate. But it was good to						
18	see her and that, you know, she's not in the hospital and						
19	she's dong somewhat better than she was before.						
20	MR. CHERSON: Good to hear.						
21	MS. ACQUAH: Yeah.						
22	MR. FINGER: Just a thought.						
23	MS. RUBIN: Last						
24	MS. STEWART: Can't hear you, Elsa.						
25	MS. RUBIN: Yeah, last time I spoke to her, she told						

1	me that she has two sisters that are very sick and that
2	she has to
3	MR. FINGER: All right. It was
4	MS. RUBIN: not care for them, but she has to be
5	tending their health.
6	MR. FINGER: I move to adjourn.
7	MS. ACQUAH: Um-hum.
8	MR. CHERSON: Second.
9	MS. ACQUAH: Yes.
10	MS. RUBIN: Okay. This meeting is adjourned. Thank
11	you, everybody, for everything.
12	MS. ACQUAH: Thank you.
13	MS. RUBIN: Stay healthy.
14	MS. ACQUAH: Have a wonderful
15	MS. SANTIAGO: Everybody. Yes.
16	MS. RUBIN: Happy holidays to everybody.
17	MS. ACQUAH: Yes, happy holidays.
18	MR. CHERSON: You, as well.
19	MS. SANTIAGO: Thank you. Thank you.
20	MS. BARNES: Thank you, everybody. Okay.
21	MR. FINGER: Make sure you go out there to vote.
22	MS. ACQUAH: Yes.
23	MS. SANTIAGO: Yes.
24	MS. STEWART: Yes.
25	MS. BARNES: Go out to vote. Please put yes.

1	MR. FINGER: Make those phone calls. Take care.
2	MS. BARNES: Vote like your life depends on it.
3	Right.
4	MS. SANTIAGO: Yes.
5	MS. STEWART: Because it does.
6	MS. BARNES: It does.
7	MR. FINGER: Um-hum. We all agree to that.
8	MS. ACQUAH: Okay.
9	MS. STEWART: Take care.
10	MS. BARNES: Okay.
11	MS. ACQUAH: Bye.
12	MS. STEWART: Thanks, Peter.
13	MS. SANTIAGO: Bye-bye.
14	MR. STECKER: Bye everybody.
15	MS. BARNES: Thank you, Peter.
16	MS. ACQUAH: Thank you, Peter.
17	MR. STECKER: All right. Sure thing. Thank you.
18	All right. Thank you, everybody.
