Additions to: New York State Action Plan Incorporating Amendments 8-33

In sections: Proposed Allocation of Funds; and throughout the Action Plan wherever referenced for Office Name and Website updates.

Summary:

Action Plan Amendment 34 (APA 34) will address the following items:

- A. *Office Name and Website Update*: Updates throughout to reflect updated office name and website.
- B. *Proposed Allocation of Funds*: Table and references to allocation amounts updated to reflect the reallocation of funds between programs and inclusion of anticipated of Program Income.

Changes are indicated in red text.

A. Office Name and Website Update

Description of changes: Updates throughout the State’s Action Plan to reflect the updated office name and website. Governor Kathy Hochul announced that the Governor’s Office of Storm Recovery (GOSR) would become a permanent office under a new name, the Office of Resilient Homes and Communities (RHC). With this update, the State is changing any reference to “the Governor’s Office of Storm Recovery” or “GOSR” throughout the Action Plan to the “Office of Resilient Homes and Communities” or “RHC.” Additional updates throughout the Action Plan to reflect RHC’s updated website at <https://hcr.ny.gov/resilient-homes-and-communities>. Through this Action Plan Amendment, references to the previous website will be updated throughout the Action Plan wherever referenced.

B. Proposed Allocation of Funds

Description of changes: All updates associated with the APA 34 allocation of funds will be made to the tables at page 8 and page 57 of the State’s Action Plan. Allocation amounts to reflect this reallocation will also be updated throughout the Action Plan wherever referenced.

The State has identified additional need in the Public Housing Assistance Relief component of the NY Rising Housing Program due to actual and anticipated final costs as the Program approaches closeout.

Since State funds are being used for certain costs in the NY Rising Homeowner Recovery and Rental Buildings Recovery Programs, as well as the Small Business Grants and Loans Program, the State has provided funds to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to be credited to the PL 113-2 CDBG-DR grant. Funds credited to the State’s line of credit will be reallocated to meet needs in the Public Housing Assistance Relief Program through this APA.

Additionally, the Proposed Allocation of Funds Table has been updated to include an estimate of \$200,000 in Program Income anticipated from Affordable housing projects and the sale of Acquisition properties. This estimated Program Income is being allocated to meet needs in the Public Housing Assistance Relief Program.
